
The colourful fish aquariums and industriously weaved snowflakes were indeed endearing and added to the vibrance of the Art Hub.

MUSINGS "Can words describe the fragrance of the very breath of Spring?" - Neltje Blanchan



Spring is all about new beginnings and transformations. Spring brings back memories unmatched and unparalleled as it reminds me of that time of the year when I could fly colourful kites with my brothers, ride a speedy bike with my father, plant a kitchen garden with my mother, read a light-hearted book with my sister and resort to old fashioned picnics with my friends.

It was a season to rejoice after the stressful weeks of annual exams, a season to linger onto creams of choco-bar, a season to run behind delicate butterflies amidst fragrant blossoms in the garden, a season of lazy afternoons and a season of colours not just on the mystique Earth but also in the vibrant sky.

These were some simple beliefs and actualities of my favourite season-spring. As I got down to pen down the musings of my heart about spring, I had stranger yet scientific revelations about my simple spring. These revelations made me conclude that spring is not just a season where temperature is pleasant, butterflies flutter, flowers bloom, squirrels run around trees and birds chirp, without reasons.
