
Chievements ARHAM GADA






ANVAY VARSHNEY

DR. LATHA OPHELIA GEORGE




(Jeachers' (Day Velebration


EDUCATIONAL TRIP

The students of Grades 7 and 9 embarked on an educational excursion to Vidhan Soudha, the seat of the Karnataka State Legislature, on 13 and 14 October 2025 respectively.

Upon arrival, the students beheld the architectural magnificence of Vidhan Soudha – a monumental creation of locally-sourced granite, built in the Neo-Dravidian style completed in 1956. The edifice was conceived by Kengal Hanumanthaiah, to reflect Indian architectural elements and





EDUCATIONAL TRIP

As the students walked along the stately corridors, they glimpsed the offices of ministers and cabinet members before proceeding to the Legislative Assembly Hall (Vidhan Sabha) and the Legislative Council Hall (Vidhan Parishad). Officials explained the roles of the two Houses and the features that make each chamber unique. Both halls are pillarless; their expansive roofs are supported by trusses and concealed support columns.

The chambers are acoustically designed, and the seats are so arranged that every member has an unobstructed view of the Speaker's Chair. The Well of the House, situated at the centre, is reserved for parliamentary reporters and stenographers. Students also observed motifs and emblems representing ideals associated with justice, progress and governance incorporated into the décor and noted the portraits of eminent national leaders adorning the walls.

The visit proved both enlightening and memorable, providing students with a first-hand experience of the functioning of the state government and the bicameral legislative system whilst also enabling them to appreciate the building's architectural and historical significance, thus enriching and extending their classroom learning.

The students of Grade 7 visited Shri Rakum School for the Blind, a residential institution for visually challenged and orphaned children located in Indiranagar. Girst Hid Awareness FOR TEACHERS

A First Aid Awareness Session was conducted on 17th September 2025 in the school auditorium for all teaching staff. The session was facilitated by the school nurse, Ms. Deeksha G. S, and Ms. Smita Mathew, with the objective of educating teachers on the identification and management of common medical emergencies in the school environment.

The session covered a wide range of everyday medical situations including cuts, scrapes, nosebleeds, fainting, seizures, sprains, and fractures. Emphasis was placed on the importance of the DR ABC method (Danger, Response, Airway, Breathing, Circulation) as a structured approach to managing emergencies.

Key first aid procedures were explained through visual presentations, hands-on demonstrations, and interactive discussions, enabling teachers to gain both theoretical knowledge and practical skills. In addition, teachers were guided on their responsibilities before, during, and after a medical emergency, ensuring preparedness and effective response.

The session proved to be highly informative and practical, equipping teachers with essential first aid knowledge and reinforcing the importance of immediate and appropriate action in safeguarding student health and well-being.



इस मुद्रा से होने वाले लाभ अनिगनत हैं | यह हमारे मस्तिष्क के दोनों भागों में संतुलन बनाए रखती है | यह मानवता एवं मित्रता को संवर्धित करती है | हमारे अहं को नियन्त्रित करती है, एवं वाणी में मधुरता का संचार करती है | यह मुद्रा हमारे अन्दर सकारात्मक ऊर्जा उत्पन्न करती है, मन को शान्त करती है, शान्त मन से आत्मचिंतन के द्वारा हम प्रतिकूल परिस्थितयों में भी मानसिक संतुलन बनाए रखते हुए अपने लक्ष्य को प्राप्त कर सकते हैं | इस मुद्रा के नियमित अभ्यास से आप अपने मन को नियंत्रित कर एकाग्रता के साथ अध्ययन कर सकते हैं |

अब आप सब समझ गए होंगे कि क्यों यह मुद्रा हमारी संस्कृति एवं दिनचर्या का अभिन्न अंग है|अतः आप प्रार्थना करते समय इन सभी बातों का ध्यान रखें और स्वयं को सशक्त बनाएं|
