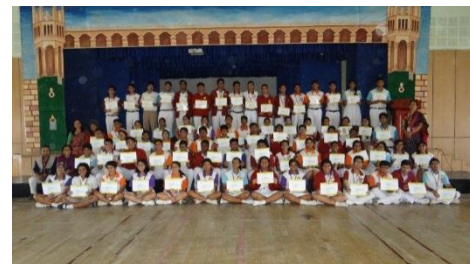
Art Exhibition

Achievements

First Lego League India

Destination Imagination Challenge 2018

A global competition that promotes collaborative problem solving challenges, communication, perseverance and critical thinking saw **Rishi Rajesh of Grade 5 A** along with his team members from other schools sail through the

Regional Level. They will participate in the Global finals to be held at Tennessee in the month of May, 2018. The team had chosen the technical challenge 'Maze Traveller', wherein they had to create a robot navigator that would move through a given random maze, in the allotted time. In addition, they had to create an instant prop transformation, perform an object removal using the Maze traveller, and combine it all using a story line.

The Indian Association of Physics Teachers (IAPT) conducted a series of Olympiads (the National Standard Examinations or NSEs) in Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Astronomy in November 2017. **Chinmay SI of Grade 12** received a certificate of merit for being in the national top 1% in NSEP (Physics) and a certificate of merit for being in the state top 1% in NSEA (Astronomy). **Dhwani Ravi and Manish Kausik of Grade 12** received a certificate of merit for being in the state top 1% in NSEB (Biology) & NSEC (Chemistry) respectively.

Chinmay SI and Dhwani Ravi additionally qualified for the second level of Olympiad held on 27th & 28th January 2018 by Homi Bhabha Centre for Science Education in Astronomy (INAO) and Biology (INBO) respectively.

They have been selected out of 11 students from Karnataka to participate in the International Orientation cum Selection Camp in Mumbai.

The Times of India recently conducted the Times SPARK Scholarship exam aimed at encouraging students to develop a better understanding of the contemporary society. Students had

to read the assigned articles within a time frame of 3 months after which an examination was conducted, followed by a personal interview. Two lakh students participated across the country out of which 300 were shortlisted for the final scholarship amount ranging between 1 and 2 lakhs. **Kurchi Mitra, Aditya Mishra (Grade 11) and Dhwani Ravi (Grade 12)** were among the 300 national level winners.

SFS

The close of the academic year 2017-18, brought with it the close of a beautiful educational journey for twenty students and a team of hardworking enthusiasts wanting to give back to the society. **‘Students for Students’** or simply SFS, was an exquisite joyride well-spaced throughout the better part of the year. In approximately fifteen sessions, a team of students from Grade 7 & 8 took on the unique role of teachers to the Grade 3& 4

students of a local government school. Under the prompt leadership of Mr. Rama Voruganti and his team, the sessions apart from educating children, briefed the ‘neo teachers’ about the supposedly simple but paramount concepts in rudimentary Mathematics and Science, as well as vital qualities like teamwork, coordination and quick thinking. Every session was an in-depth lunge into the portrayal of these concepts in the simplest yet effective manner of practical experiments and interactive quizzes. The children learnt basic number concepts, water cycle, food chain, sound, mathematical operations etc. It was an out-of-classroom based education in the classroom, really!

To showcase the students learning through the year, a Grand Finale was held on the 9th of March 2018, where separate groups entertained the audience with well-rehearsed skits, poems and speeches. This entire journey has been extremely invigorating, and gratifying as our students appreciated the amount of hard work their teachers put in for the students. A million thanks to the SFS team will not suffice for the eternal gems of wisdom these ‘teachers’ procured through this cause.

The amount of effort put in by the team to make it a success has been well worth it and the only regret would be it ended far too soon. In earnest wait for the next year, ‘Students for students’ is an organization, a journey, an experience but more so a blessing!



Ashoka Award Ceremony

Better Plus Schools in partnership with AshokaYouth Venturers conducted the “Change Maker Awards” ceremony on 20th February, 2018 to celebrate the winners of the Changemaker Challenge 2017-18, a competition organized as part of the Changemaker Education subject for grade 7. The challenge ran for 3 months from November 2017 to January 2018, where students were encouraged to launch changemaker initiatives to solve real-world problems in home, school or their communities. This witnessed the birth of massive 22 different changemaker initiatives by grade 7 students in teams of 4, solving social problems like stopping bullying in the classrooms, educating underprivileged kids, spreading awareness about smoking and even targeted environmental problems like saving household water, planting trees and using environment-friendly detergents.

Through this entire activity, the students had the opportunity to solve real world problems hands-on, working in teams thereby building skills of empathy, team work, creative problem solving and collaborative leadership; the much needed change maker skills of the 21st century. The criteria of evaluation for this Changemaker Challenge were social impact, teamwork, impact measurement and documentation of the work.

The winners were announced in the following categories.

1. Gold Award for 'All-round performance'- Initiative 'Blue Drop' by **Ankita A, Divya N, G V Rashvi** and **Swati N of 7C**, who installed 23+ tap aerators in 11+ households, worked brilliantly as a team and documented their work thoroughly.

2. Teamwork Award for 'Exemplified teamwork'- Initiative 'Let Nature Be Our Teacher'- by **Adhithi NK, Andrina L, Neha C, Sharvari B** and **Shivani GK of 7A**, who worked throughout as a team, delegating responsibility to each team member and making them accountable.

3. Social Impact Award for 'Very high social impact'- Initiative 'Profitable E-waste' by **Aakarsh P, C Satvik, Rishit P and Shreyas P of 7 B** who collected and recycled 570 kg of e-waste and donated Rs 21,600/- received from recycling it. The joint winner was the initiative "APNA" by **Achyuth W, Akshaj B, Nand V, P E Pranav of 7C** who saved more than 3000+ litres of domestic water by installing 65+ tap aerators in 40 plus households.

4. Impact Monitoring Award for 'Measuring and presenting their impact in the most detailed manner'- Initiative 'Waste to Strays" by **Adithri A R, Adrika C, Manjari R** and **Sharduli T** of 7A who fed 28 stray dogs on a regular basis with the help of 80 volunteers and measured the impact of their work in a detailed manner in the final report.

Swati N (7C), Yash P(7C), Manjari R(7A) and Mansi AK (7B) were awarded "Changemaker of the Year 2017-18" award for exemplifying the skills of empathy, teamwork, creative problem solving and collaborative leadership throughout the year in the classroom and outside.



CISCO Outreach Program

The Cisco talent outreach program was initiated in July 2017 as a collaboration between Cisco and other high school students from various schools in Bangalore. **Aniket Sanghi, Aditya Naidu, Kaustubh Roy, Ayush Agrawal, Rajat Agarwal** and **Rajdeep Nag** represented our school. They were given the opportunity to develop any application of their choice over the course of 6 months along with their mentors. They chose to create a public service app which would be simple and effective for the people of Bangalore and agreed on an Ambulance Alert System.

With the help of a simple application, they attempted to create a service which would reduce the time and allow Ambulances to reach their destinations within the crucial "Golden Hour". The app sends a notification of an incoming ambulance to all drivers or anyone travelling within a kilometer's radius of its path. From July to January, the students worked online from home under the able guidance of their mentors. Through extensive trial and error they learnt Java and PHP, gained work experience and gained an insight into the functioning of corporates.

There were time limits and deadlines to meet. They also had several meetings with the Cisco representatives.

On the 31st of January, 2018 a formal project presentation was made to all the participating groups as well the Cisco representatives.

They hope to incorporate this project with the Bangalore police and Hospitals as well in the near future.



TingaTinga Tales

On 16th February, 2018, KG1 culminated the EVS topic "Animal World" by students coming to school enthusiastically dressed in their favourite animal characters and presented their stories with suitable props. The class buzzed with joy and laughter and the children were excited to display the various props they had created with the help of their parents. The confidence and presentation skills of the KG1 children were admirable.

The children tried their hand at making the soil mix, sowing the seeds and

even tasting the fresh hand-picked produce.

The farm was quite modernised in its use of rainwater harvesting pits, drip irrigation, flow form and in house biogas and fertilizer production. The students and accompanying teachers were also given a unique chance to purchase seeds of good organic quality to try emulating the Annadana cause and a taste of fresh chilled juice. The students were briefed on the demerits of inorganically grown and bred plants and the shocking revelation of famous fast food actually being blatant carriers of repulsive preservatives and a storehouse of diseases.
